As the days rush by towards Christmas, may I write in thanks for the tremendous love and care you have given your families in such a hard year.

Many of us are joyful at the simple prospect of 2020 being over!



# The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate

I would recommend this book to 9+. It's easy to read but the concept is not really for kids under 9.

Our ERP expo was held on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> and the grade sixes were very thankful to the classes that came and saw what we have been working so hard on this term.


