Dear families,

Lent comes around each year and presents us with its usual challenge to take stock of our lives, to see more clearly what is in our hearts, and to discover what might be calling us out of our comfort zones. It is a time to consider how we might respond to the pain of the world and of its inhabitants. It is a time for personal as well as group reflection, a time for entering into "the wilderness" and for grappling with the mysteries of life. It is a time of preparation for Easter when we will renew our baptismal vows and celebrate the greatest mysteries of our faith.

Ash Wednesday signals the beginning of the church's season of Lent. Lent lasts a period of forty days where we prepare our hearts and minds for the Easter mystery. Almsgiving and fasting and prayer are honoured ways to do this, and we are all invited to do this in 3 traditional ways:

Thank God for our existence as earthlings with a fantastic destiny. This expression of gratitude to the Creator is itself Prayer, the first of the tripods of Lent. Live a little more simply for the traditional forty days in imitation of Our Lord's fasting before embarking on his public ministry: Fasting, the second tripod of Lent. Be generous during Project Compassion, for we share the same genesis as every other human being. Our common humanity obliges to sharing what we can: Almsgiving, the third tripod of Lent.

After a lengthy discussion as a staff group, we have decided that cooking and sharing of pancakes in class groups as well as having a pancake breakfast, even with hygienic practices in place, is an unnecessary risk. We will still explore the important historical significance and modern day commitments associated with the beginning of Lent.

On a brighter note, we will be celebrating Ash Wednesday Mass together at 9:15am and would love to invite all members of our school community to join us.




