### **Hand Sanitiser**

As part of our OH&S compliance, the school is supplying hand sanitiser for students to use. Hand sanitiser is a chemical and different brands have different ingredients. Therefore, if students are bringing their own to school we don't have the data sheets etc. in the event of a reaction. Students travelling to school on buses may keep personal hand sanitiser in a zipped compartment of their bags.


We would also be very appreciative of any non-perishable food items and warm, clean blankets which you can bring to the church or school.
