Dear Families,




Remote Learning

Learning times

It is unrealistic to attempt replicating a regular daily program with students following the 9:00-3:15 routine. Family arrangements differ vastly and we aim to provide you with a program that is as flexible as possible.

The recommended times for corresponding levels are as follows:

- For students in Prep to Year 2, schools should engage in learning programs that include the following:
 - literacy activities that take a total of about 45–60 minutes
 - numeracy activities of around 30-45 minutes
 - additional learning areas, such as Religion, Inquiry and Specialists of about 30–45 minutes
- For students in Years 3 to 6, students should engage in learning programs allocated as follows:
 - literacy: 45–60 minutes
 - numeracy: 30–45 minutes
 - physical activities: 30 minutes
 - additional curriculum areas such as Religion, Inquiry and Specialists: 90 minutes.

School Photo Day 2020 - St Mary's Primary School, Castlemaine


