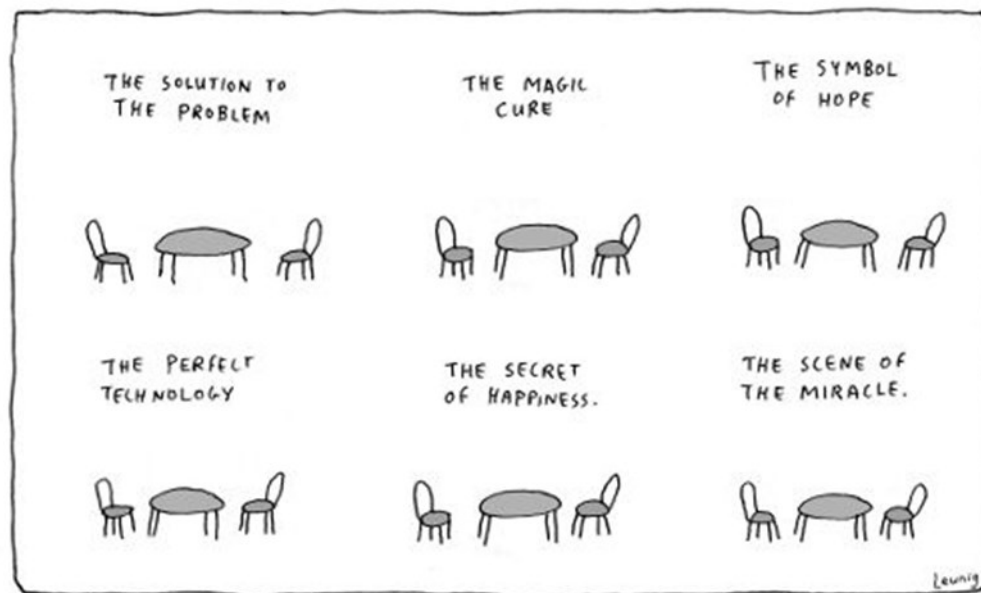

Sustainability Update



Last term we purchased new chooks with the proceeds from our garden produce sales. Thank you to all the families that support this initiative. It's great to hear the feedback about our organic produce and the wonderful ways you have utilised it. At the moment the garden is fairly quiet due to the cold and also the seedlings we put in being very small at the time of planting. The beds are full though and should be producing more food soon. The Grade 6's planted two beds of broad beans on Friday along with making some artistic support structures. The Grade 2/3's have been learning about and doing some seed saving. We cut up and harvested seeds from our pumpkins that we grew last season and are currently drying them ready to plant this spring. There are still pumpkins for sale in the foyer - gold coin donation!

In regards to naming our two new chooks that have joined Moonlight, each student was allowed to nominate one name per chook. It was then randomly drawn. No votes, no tallies, just a random name. Luckily we had two winners that seem to have captured the look and personalities of our chooks.

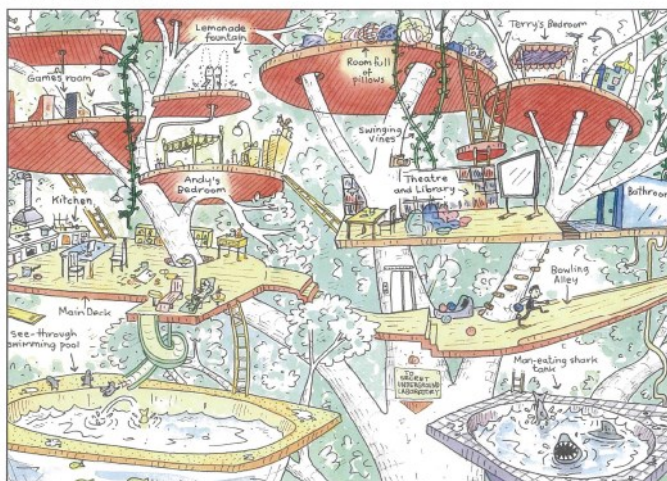
