We pay our respects to the Elders of the past, present and future and acknowledge their spiritual connection to Country.







CEMSIS Surveys

In 2019, our school is participating in Catholic Education Melbourne School Improvement Surveys (CEMSIS). CEMSIS is an annual process where schools listen to the thoughts and feelings students, families and staff have about how their school can improve. These surveys help inform the ongoing improvement of schools across the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

One of the main goals of the family survey is to identify the strengths and areas for improvement in our school. CEMSIS data benefits everyone within our school and provides valuable community insights on areas that each school can focus on. Our school believes it is important to encourage families to have a voice and contribute to shaping the ongoing improvement of the school.

The survey is available online, can be accessed from **Monday 2 September** and needs to be completed by **Friday 20 September**. This survey may only be completed once.

For families where there may be more than one child attending our school, we ask that families focus on the eldest child attending the school. The school has invited many families to respond via this survey and participation is completely voluntary. There are no "right" or "wrong" answers – all responses are completely anonymous and at no point are any of the responses from students, families or staff identifiable by the school.

Twilight Sports

The children are getting excited about our Twilight Sports coming up on September 18th. The events will begin at 2.15pm with the children marching onto the oval in their teams and finish at approximately 6pm. We welcome you to bring an afternoon tea picnic and enjoy the events. A coffee van will supply coffee and tea for those who wish to purchase warm drinks.

OLSEL

Oral language skills support children to learn to read and write. Our teachers have embedded OLSEL in their teaching practice. Each week your children extend their vocabulary, learn about how words work and engage in conversation with the view to develop a broad range of vocabulary, learn spelling and writing skills and in understanding spelling knowledge's and what words mean, this assists them with reading. The Oral Language Supporting Early Literacy research initiative seeks to develop the oral language competence of students to facilitate literacy development. The goal of the research



initiative is centred around professional learning to support teachers to more effectively plan and implement strategies which specifically target the development of oral language skills with a particular focus on the early years of schooling.

Oral language competence is crucial for literacy development, with an increasing body of evidence identifying it as a key indicator of children's early reading ability. Chan and Dally (2000) further expand the body of evidence linking oral language proficiency to the development of literacy skills and argue a causal relationship stating that '... limitations in oral language abilities are at the basis of early reading difficulties experienced by students.'

Reading Hour in Australia & St Mary's!

On Thursday September 19th 2019, we will stop what we're doing and pick up a book! Rather than have our assembly at 2.30pm we invite you to join your child/children in the classrooms or library and read. We value this initiative which encourages Australians to either rediscover or introduce themselves to the benefits of reading; to take the time to learn, escape and relax.



In children, reading has been shown to help with identity formation, setting them up for success in the future. In adults, reading has been shown to reduce stress by 68% more than listening to music, going for a walk, or having a cup of tea.

We hope that you can join us from 2.30 until 3.15 (You may stay later if you like) to immerse ourselves in literature.

Principal Study Tour Intensive program - Learning from Each Other

I have been fortunate to have been offered a position to take part in a program teaching religious diversity. The program is offered through a partnership with the Australian Catholic University (ACU) and Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam. Catholic Education Melbourne offers a range of formation programs for principals and emerging leaders, designed to



support their formation for strong and effective religious leadership. This particular program is a residential program of 10 days' duration taking place at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam in the Netherlands over the school holidays.

This formation program will deliver a multimodal experience, attending to the following questions:

How may we, as Catholics, make sense of the phenomenon of religious diversity? Why are there
so many religions and how do they relate to one another?

- How do different models of religious diversity impact upon the way we understand the possibility/impossibility of interreligious dialogue?
- What resources does Catholic tradition offer to learn with and from the other?
- How do we shape Catholic dialogical schools that welcome those who believe and practice
- differently?
- How can we enable a deep learning across traditions in our classrooms?

I am looking forward to:

- The opportunity to engage in a collegial conversation on how to enhance Catholic Identity through interreligious dialogue.
- An in-depth introduction to the best in current scholarship and teaching resources in the areas of theologies of religious pluralism, comparative theology and scriptural reasoning.
- Support in developing teaching resources, syllabi, and other programming appropriate to the particular needs of our school.

Through classes, reading assignments, and visits to local communities' I will be supported to effectively engage in a deep learning across religious traditions. The program also introduces participants to a variety of dialogical approaches which we may use in our own schools i.e:

- Self-Reflection via Logbook
- Scriptural Reasoning
- Bibliodrama
- Comparative theologies of religions
- On site visits
- Excursions to schools and teacher training programs in the Netherlands

I appreciate the opportunity to take part in and learn from this study program which is funded by CEM Melbourne and will take place over the school holidays. It will mean that I will be out of school on September 19th & 20th and I will return in the first week of Term 4 on October 10th.



Communication Boards

We do our best to keep you informed about all aspects of school life. In addition to what we already do via the newsletter, facebook, CareMonkey, Flexibuzz, school calendar, staff emails and our website, you will notice the addition of communication boards outside your children's classrooms from now and the beginning of next term. We hope that they give you a further avenue to keep informed about what is happening in your child's

classroom. We ask that you make some time to read the newsletter each week. It is the central document we use to let you know about school activities as well as up and coming events.

Speech Pathologist Hayley Millard

Some of our families have already engaged the services of our speech pathologist here at St. Mary's on a Wednesday or a Thursday. I have met with Hayley Millard who has been working in this area for over 7 years. Most of her experience has been with primary age children. Your child may attend 5 visits which can be subsidised by Medicare. The Medicare rebate under the Chronic Disease Management (CDM) Program is \$53.80 per session. Families need to see their GP to determine eligibility for a



CDM plan. Hayley can provide families with more information about the CDM program, as required.

Outdoor Classroom Plans

We are in the process of creating an outdoor learning/play area under the library. Our whiteboard has arrived and our blackboard is in transit. We will also use some of our older tables and chairs. If you have anything you would like to donate to this space let us know. The purpose is to develop an area outdoors where the children can draw, create and play.


Second hand Uniform - Calling for Donations
