The Green Hat workshop provided a forum for our children to express their creativity and thinking skills by responding to a prompt and constructing



Regeneration Film

Our 4-6 students along with our staff learned more about what measures can be taken to help regenerate soils, forests and watercourses.







It was an Australian produced documentary which gave us a message of hope if communities act now. We learned that we have the knowledge and the technologies to make renewable energy our main energy sources and that if we work together we have the capacity to regenerate local communities and economies that have fallen by the wayside as economic globalisation has become a dominant force.

Respectful Relationships

Respectful relationships education is about building positive relationships for all young people. Respectful

Relationships is part of the curriculum. It promotes respect and gender equality and helps students learn how to build healthy relationships. As part of our Wellbeing work Mark O'Sullivan has started this program with our children. This week they learned more about empathy and why it is important to 'read' another person's body language and imagine how they might be feeling. We encourage you to use this opportunity which is a great way to promote communication between school and home. It supports the student, teacher and the parents to work together toward our children's learning and social wellbeing. Three-way conferences take the form of a conversation between the student, their parents and their teacher. They give our students an opportunity to share with their parents their growth as a learner. Through this process children can accept accountability and responsibility for their progress and achievement, and demonstrate a growing understanding of their development as independent learners.



In three-way conferencing all three parties - student, parents and the teacher - sit together and talk about the student's learning, with the student taking
