Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

I hope that you have all enjoyed your two week break and that you feel ready to embrace Term 4!

I am very happy to be back at school after an intense but most worthwhile two weeks studying comparative theology, inter-faith dialogue, scriptural reasoning and Eucharistic hospitality at Vrije Universiteit in south Amsterdam.

This study tour was the first focusing in this area in response to what we very well know; that Religion is transforming, pluralisation is a fact, it is happening and it is time when we are called to re-contextualise.

Our school is indeed blessed with the diversity of multi-races, beliefs and faith backgrounds. I know that we are all dedicated towards respecting our cultural diversity.

As a staff we often question how we can both honour and include those of other faith backgrounds and with varied beliefs at the same time as maintaining our Catholic identity. This has been more challenging during this period when the Catholic church is under scrutiny.

As a staff and in partnership with you we aim to truly bear witness to our school's vision and mission. We actively respond to religious diversity, the aim of which is to build bridges across religions and traditions so that our school is a place of witness, openness, inclusion and dialogue and one where our Catholic identity is evident in a healthy and relevant way. Moreover, this will also support our students to grow up as understanding, respectful and tolerant citizens.



You may have read about the distressing news article about some young Jewish boys being mocked by other students in a Melbourne school. This is another reason why developing knowledge and understanding about the 'other' through inter-faith dialogue is critical.

In our roles we need to do our very best to deal with otherness so we are doing more than giving attention to pluralisation and secularisation. Critically, we want to build a theology of love, one that refuses the violence that may be committed by one against another, one that equips our children to be all that they can be to create compassionate and caring communities.



Our students sang beautifully at our beginning of term Mass where Fr. Wahid encouraged them to continue to do their best. We are hoping to see as many of you as possible on Sunday to support Sebastian and Lucas who are making their first communion. This is also a commitment Mass for the children receiving the sacrament of confirmation later this term. There will be a morning tea after Mass. If you have time it would be lovely if you could bring a plate of food to share.



We are looking forward to working with you all again this term where collectively we hope to continue to make a positive difference in our children's lives.
