Whilst in recovery the following article caught my attention and I would like to share it with you.

This is learning, knowing that you'll get it, even if you haven't gotten it yet.

Because the most beautiful, complex concepts in the whole universe are built on basic ideas that anyone can learn,

I was then prompted to reflect on our work here at St. Mary's... as we do daily. The influence of us all, parents, families and teachers collectively.

Our children engaged in a tree planting ceremony last Friday to support National Tree Planting day and to continue to do what we can to care for our planet. The children planted some fruit trees and we look forward to watching them grow!

Our annual Book Parade will happen at 9:00am following our morning prayer – you are all warmly invited to attend. That same week we will be hosting our Annual Scholastic Book Fair. Prep-One Treasure Boxes

Our Prep-One students enjoyed sharing their treasure boxes with their buddies this week. Their treasures sparked curiosity and provided great stimulus for discussion. It was a great way of developing oral language and it enabled our children to learn more about each other.



Chess



We congratulate our children who competed in the Bendigo Chess Championships on July 30th. Our players did very well! We thank Harry for his ongoing commitment to passing on his passion of playing chess to our children. Harry provided the following report about the day, "St Marys came third with Jack Morelli our top performing student. Jack was 8th overall followed by Dylan Pozar 9th. Patrick Leatham 17th, and Amelia Lizzul came 24th and she was the second best performing girl on the day. Thomas and Ryan Mulholland came 30th and

33rd respectively. From their feedback and the results, I think they had a good day with lots of challenges. They were positive and calm all day, really well behaved, and showed a lot of resilience. Not least of all they were well mannered and respectful which is something St. Mary's students are well known for."

Masterplan

I have had several more meetings with our architect and we are progressing in the queue which means we should be ready to get started in Term 4. Our project is estimated to take 3-4 months so we hope to be moved back into our renovated classrooms by mid-Term 1 2020. This project will involve lifting and replacing the leaking roof over the corridor which runs outside our four main classrooms, the installation of glass sliding doors so that our rooms can be opened up as required and learning spaces made more contemporary and flexible. We will also recarpet and paint the areas. Plans can be viewed in the front foyer and we welcome your feedback. We have been fortunate to be successful in receiving a grant of \$500,00.00 to fund the bulk of this project. This is terrific news for our school. The remainder of the costs which could be up to \$200,000.00 will be funded by an interest free loan through Catholic Education Melbourne which can be paid back over 15 years. I am in the process of applying for other grants which would cover some of these extra expenses i.e. soft furnishings or carpet. This would then reduce the amount we would need to borrow for expenses beyond the \$500,000.00.

School Fees

We thank you for your efforts in keeping the payment of school fees up to date. We rely on the collection of our fees to provide educational programs for our children. If you are experiencing financial difficulty, please make an appointment to discuss options with me.

This is a great opportunity for those interested to be an active member of our Church community and to develop their confidence in a leadership role. There will be one more training session and this date will be announced next week.






