School Psychologist

Building Refurbishment

We have been fortunate to have been successful in our application for supplementary funding from CEM to refurbish our four classrooms and to redo the leaking roof over the corridor. We now have a masterplan as communicated last year and we are in the process of organising our Building Design Services Agreement.

We will then advertise for Tenders and hope to start the building works in fourth term. The work should be completed by the end of term one. Our classes will run as usual from the Arts Hub, Library and Original School Building. We will keep you informed throughout the process.

St Mary's Choir


