Dear Families,

As we moved to remote learning as a result of COVID-19, our usual ways of working and engaging with students have looked different in Term 2. We again move towards another significant change, and we will adapt and succeed together.

Included in this change has been how we assess and report on student learning. Our school, teachers, students and families have all had to adapt, change and respond to the landscape – sometimes on a daily basis. There have been countless positive opportunities and new learning, but there have also been challenges and we have each responded as best we can on a weekly basis.

I thank your child for all they have achieved and all they have contributed – they should be proud of their efforts, even in the challenging moments. Thank you to each parent/carer and family member for your encouragement, feedback, patience and willingness to engage with us to support your child's ongoing wellbeing and learning. Also, thank you to the highly dedicated staff at St Mary's for your flexibility, ingenuity and resilience in completely unique circumstances.

An online experience for all students

Next Wednesday 20th May at 10am we have a special online guest. Melbourne author, George Ivanoff, will be running an online video conference with all students from P-6. He has written over 100 books for children and teenagers having books listed on the Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge list. George will provide a general presentation discussing his journey to becoming an author, an introduction to some of his books and the writing process.



Classroom teachers will post a link for the online meeting on Google Classroom on Wednesday morning. The conferencing platform may be either Google Meet or Zoom, but this will be clarified with ample time provided to setup/join.

Assessment and Reporting

I would ask you to appreciate that the content on which we report will be reduced this semester, as the usual assessments undertaken in the everyday classroom have not been possible this term.

Teachers have used a broad evidence-base to make their own balanced assessments of your child's progress at this point in time. Such evidence includes teacher observations, Term 1 assessments, notes and work samples.

The end of year report (December) will provide a more comprehensive view of the year's learning across all usual curriculum areas.

Please don't hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher or myself for clarification. I thank you for understanding the variations in this Semester 1 report, as impacted by the change in learning environments this term, and the approach our school has taken.

Transitioning back to Onsite Learning

Following advice from the Chief Health Officer, the Victorian Government and the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Ltd (CECV) have advised that schools can begin a phased return to onsite schooling.

In the **first stage**, the CECV advised that students in Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 return to school from Tuesday 26th May. Due to our class structures, the most practicable **return will include the Prep, Grade 1, Grade 2 & Grade 3 classes during the first stage.** It would not be reasonable to maintain an onsite program for Grade 2 and remote learning for Grade 3 concurrently.

To support all school staff to prepare for this transition, Monday 25th May will be a school closure day.

In the **second stage** of our return to onsite schooling, Grade 4, 5 & 6 will return to school from Tuesday 9th June.

For those students who cannot be supervised at home and vulnerable children, the existing model of onsite schooling will remain in place during the two-week period from Tuesday 26th May to Tuesday 9th June. The current process that we are using to enable parents and carers to indicate the days or part-days for which onsite schooling is required will continue for this two-week period.

All other students in those year levels will continue learning from home until Tuesday 9th June.

Once a year level has returned, all students will be expected to attend school as normal. This means if you choose to keep your child/children home after their year level has returned to onsite schooling, we can no longer support their learning from home. This does not apply to children who need to be absent for health or medical reasons. For those families, please contact us so we can make an appropriate plan.

This same approach is being taken by all Catholic and government schools in Victoria.

To support the health and wellbeing of all students and staff, our school will continue an enhanced cleaning routine and will encourage frequent handwashing.

If your child is ill or is feeling unwell, they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice. In the event of a suspected or confirmed case the school will be immediately closed.

While the Chief Health Officer has advised that students will not be required to maintain physical distancing at school, there will be a number of important changes to our school operations, consistent with health advice to all schools that will be made available prior to recommencement of onsite learning. I will provide more details about our local school context as required, but it is important to note that changes will include:

- adjusted arrangements for drop-off and pick-up where the only entry/exit point is the Templeton Street gate (beside admin area).
- restrictions on access to the school site for anyone other than immediate school staff and students. Unless pre-arranged appointments are made, only students and staff can be onsite.
- Gr 2/3 will be relocated from the Buckley room to Dhelkunya for greater airflow and spacing.

We understand that some families may feel anxious about this move back to classroom teaching and learning. I can assure you that this decision has been taken on the basis of the best health advice available to our state.

Thank you for your continued support and patience during this time. It was great to have so many families join our Zoom meeting. Many of your questions have enabled us to provide a transition plan with greater clarity.

We look forward to welcoming students back to the classroom.

Closure Days for Term 2

Prior to the outbreak of COVID-19 St Mary's was scheduled to undergo a school review process that occurs once every five years. This has now been postponed until 2021. As you may have noticed, there have been two school closure days listed for the school review on Thursday 4th and Friday 5th June.

After consultation with Fr Wahid, we have decided to uphold the closure days as a report writing day for staff on Thursday 4th, and a whole school mental wellness day on Friday 5th. After such a challenging and mentally draining term for all of us, I strongly encourage all members of our school community to take some time for yourselves.

Tips for staying mentally healthy

- Keep socially connected to others via phone, social media, email or Skype.
- If you're feeling lonely or anxious, visit family or friends, or invite a friend or family member to your home. Gatherings at home of up to five people at any one time can now happen in Victoria.
- If the news is bothering you, take a break from it.
- Create a routine to maintain a sense of normalcy, such as regular physical activity, cooking healthy meals and continuing to work or study if you feel well enough and can do so from home.
- Focus on what you can control for example washing your hands frequently, following physical distancing guidelines instead of what you can't control ie what other people do.
- To avoid panic, get your information from reliable sources such as the <u>federal</u> and <u>Victorian</u> health departments.
- Practice mindfulness: focus on the moment you're in. Meditation and breathing exercises can help calm your mind and reduce anxiety.
- Take stock of your emotions: it's completely normal to feel concerned or upset about what is happening. If you feel anxious, talk to a trusted friend or family member or seek professional help: Phone Lifeline: 13 11 14, BeyondBlue: 1300 224 636 or Headspace: 1800 650 890.

School Photo Day 2020 – St Mary's Primary School, Castlemaine

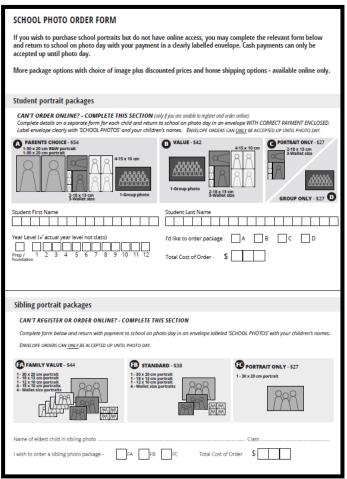

We have announced some initial measures in March to reduce financial pressures on businesses and the community including:
